If you are passionate about making creative and innovative design changes to improve your home, or if you are considering a career in interior design, this is the course for you.

Interior Design (Developing Skills) Thursday 5 weeks £81

Using a range of practical skills you will create an on-trend interior design mood board which will reflect your expertise in the use of colour, texture and space planning.

Japanese (Beginners 1) Thursday 10 weeks £205

This course covers introductory Japanese speaking and listening skills along with the practical use of language in a variety of everyday situations. You will learn basic Japanese characters, pronunciation and writing, sentence structuring, verbs and adjectives.

Japanese (Beginners 2) Saturday 10 weeks £205

This course provides progression for students who have previously completed the Japanese Beginners 1 course. The course further explore Japanese speaking and listening skills enhancing understanding of Japanese characters, pronunciation, writing and conversation.

Massage (Holistic) Saturday 3 weeks £69

You will learn how to take correct measurements and adapt patterns as well as how to construct basic body blocks. By the end of the course you will have designed or adapted your own pattern enabling you to construct a truly unique item of clothing.

Photography (Beginners) Saturday / Thursday 3 weeks / 4 weeks £69

This course is ideal for anyone who has a passion for photography and wishes to develop their understanding and skills. Covering exposure, exposure composition, white balance and much more, you will learn how to get the most out of your camera, refine your skills and produce outstanding photography.

Photography (Developing Skills) Saturday / Thursday 3 weeks / 4 weeks £69

This course is suitable for anyone who has completed the Photography (Beginners) course or already has a good understanding of photography techniques. You will have the opportunity to develop your knowledge and understanding of different photography concepts and explore new techniques that will further improve your skills.

Photography (Outdoor) Saturday 3 weeks £69

This course is suitable for anyone who has completed the Photography (Beginners) course or already has a good understanding of photography techniques. You will have the opportunity to build on your existing knowledge and refine your practical skills to incorporate outdoor photography methods.

Photography (Studio) Saturday 3 weeks £69

The Studio Photography course provides an introduction to photography in a studio-based setting giving you access to the College's professional studio and lighting equipment. The course covers photography for both portrait and still life subjects.

Photography (Night Time) Thursday 4 weeks £69

This is a practical night time/long exposure course taking place in and around South Essex College in Southend. You will be given professional tuition and advice as you create your own night photographs.

Photography (Digital Black and White) Saturday 3 weeks £69

This course is ideal to learn the best camera settings for producing effective black and white images through practical sessions. You will explore the skills that are needed to become a radio presenter such as link creation, scriptwriting, interview techniques and common used studio techniques. The course offers the ability to get hands-on with studio equipment and look more at the skills needed to work in today's studio environment.

This introductory course in screen printing will teach you the basic skills and techniques that are required to create your own original prints. You will learn how to design and cut stencils, work with different colours and shapes and overlay multiple prints to gain varied effects.

Search Engine Optimisation (SEO) Thursday 4 weeks £69

The key to your website's success is making sure that your customers can find you when using a search engine. Learn the techniques and strategies that can be used to improve the performance of your website.

Search Engine Optimisation -Advanced Thursday / Saturday 4 weeks / 3 weeks £69

This course covers the advanced level of Search Engine Optimisation. You will also learn new strategies and tactics, both on and off page, and raise the bar against competitor web pages.

Social Media Marketing Saturday / Thursday 4 weeks / 5 weeks

This course offers an overview of current social media trends, the different types of services available, and the ways that today's online services could be used to enhance your career, business, or your leisure activities. The course helps those new to the subject to build and nurture an online presence, and for those already promoting via social media, valuable information on the tools and techniques available to communicate effectively online.

Spanish Beginners 1 Thursday / Saturday 10 weeks / 8 weeks £155

This beginner course in Spanish is ideal for anyone wishing to fulfil their passion for learning a new language. Whether Spanish is required for employment, you are relocating to live in a Spanish speaking country or you are simply planning a holiday and want to improve your vocabulary, this course will meet your personal needs.

Spanish Beginners 2 Thursday / Saturday 10 weeks / 8 weeks £155

As well as providing direct progression for anyone who has completed Spanish Beginners 1, this course is also suitable for anyone who already has a good basic understanding of Spanish. You will have the opportunity to enhance your knowledge in previously studied topics along with exploring new topics and scenarios.


Thurrock Campus

The College is working in partnership with relevant agencies (for example local authorities) to make extra provision for those individuals with more complex learning needs and disabilities.


We are committed to providing equal access for all our students and aim to create an inclusive environment where students are treated on the basis of their merits, ability and potential. The ALS team provides a flexible support service to students who face difficulties associated with disabilities, learning difficulties and health issues. The team take a learner-centred approach to supporting students.

ALS staff work closely with teaching staff to meet the needs of students with disabilities and learning difficulties to facilitate equal access to the curriculum.

We can support students with a range of additional needs on entry level and mainstream programmes across all our campuses.

Each of our main campuses is easily accessible and have designated disabled parking bays available which may be accessed by Blue Badge holders. In addition to our usual accessible toilet facilities, we also offer a Clos-o-Mat toilet, hoist and couch available for students with personal care needs.

For students who are hearing or visually impaired, we provide support through our sensory team to enable you to participate fully in all aspects of your learning programme.



Money matters

Depending on your circumstances and citizenship status, you may be eligible for funding and should apply to the College via the student services team.

We understand that student funding can be extremely complicated. The government's funding rules tend to change frequently. Please contact our advisers for all the latest information on 0845 52 12345. The fees in this prospectus are to be used as a guide only.

They are the fees for the academic year 2015-16 only (up to July 2016), so fees for courses starting in September 2016 may be higher. It may be summer 2016 before we are able to confirm what the fees will be. We have tried to label each course to advise you if there are 24+ loan options available or potential fee remission. This means that if you receive income-based benefits, your course may be fullyfunded. Most of the funding options depend on the availability of money allocated to the College by the government. Therefore, please bring all pages of all household income evidence to enrolment.

We suggest that you bring the following evidence, dated within the last two to three months:

- Universal Credit
- Income Support
- Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Based Incapacity Benefit
- Employment and Support Allowance
- wage slips two monthly or eight weekly
- Child Benefit

The following evidence must be dated within the current tax year unless stated otherwise:

- Housing Benefit
- Council Tax Reduction
- Working Tax Credit (income below £16,190)
- Child Tax Credit
- Pension/Pension Credit
- self employed an accountants letter is needed stating projected earnings or a photocopy of your Self Assessment Tax Return

It is always suggested that students apply for this funding as early as possible, but certainly within the first month after enrolment.

Co-funding

If you are not eligible for one of the fee waivers detailed, you may be able to receive a contribution towards your tuition fees. Look out for the cofunding fees detailed in this prospectus. These fees are partially funded by the government and represent significant discounts on the full cost rate. Call us to confirm you are eligible for co-funding.

Spread the cost

If you are aged 19 or over you could be responsible for the payment of tuition fees. If this is the case, you will be required to pay a minimum of 10% of the tuition fee at the time of enrolling, together with setting up a direct debit agreement for the remaining money. You will still be expected to do this even if you are planning, or have applied to the Discretionary Learner Support Fund and you are awaiting the decision outcome. Entry level & level 1 progression funding

If you are aged between 19 and 23 on the start date of your course and need to enrol on an entry or level 1 course before progressing on to your first full level 2 you may be eligible to have your tuition fees waived. If eligible the College will also supply the essential materials, equipment and cover the cost of any compulsory trips.

Level 2 & 3 entitlement

If you are aged between 19 and 23 on the start date of your course and are studying for your first full level 2 or 3 qualification you may be eligible to have your tuition fees waived. If eligible the College will also supply the essential materials, equipment and cover the cost of any compulsory trips.

Course fee remission: 19-23

If you are aged between 19 and 23 on the start date of your course, are studying a level 2 or 3 qualification (which isn't your first) and are unemployed and in receipt of a state benefit, you may be eligible to have your tuition fees waived. If eligible the College will also supply the essential materials, equipment and cover the cost of any compulsory trips.

Course fee remission: 24+

If you are aged 24 or over on the start date of your course, are studying for a qualification at level 2 or below and are unemployed and in receipt of a state benefit, you may be eligible to have tuition fees waived. If eligible the College will also supply the essential materials, equipment and cover the cost of any compulsory trips.

Discretionary Learner Support Fund (DLSF)

If you are aged 19 or over and on a low income you may be eligible to receive a contribution towards the additional costs associated with your course as agreed by the College, together with (Ofsted registered) childcare and travel expenses.

Professional and career development loans

National Express Foundation Bursaries

South Essex College is proud to work in partnership with the National Express Foundation. We have been awarded funding to offer assistance to students aged between 16 and 24. If you are studying a fulltime course, live close to the c2c line and you are experiencing barriers to continuing your education, you can apply for a bursary. All applications are considered by a panel, so just meeting the criteria doesn't mean you will be awarded this bursary due to the limited number of bursaries.

24+ Advanced Learning Loans

Most learners aged 24 and over, studying at level three and above, will qualify for a 24+ Advanced Learning Loan.

Your household income isn't taken into account, there's no credit check and you won't have to pay anything back until your income is over £21,000 a year.

To qualify you must be:

- aged 24 or over on the first day of your course (there's no upper age-limit)
- living in the UK on the first day of your course and have lived in the UK, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man for three years immediately before this
- enrolling on an eligible course at level three and above, such as: Access to HE Diplomas, other Diplomas and Certificates, Advanced Apprenticeships or Higher Apprenticeships

How much can I get?

The amount you can get depends on your course, the tuition fees charged and maximum amounts set by the government. The minimum loan amount is £300. You can take out a loan for the maximum amount to cover your tuition fee or you can pay all or part of the tuition fee yourself.

How's the loan paid?

Student Finance England (SFE) will pay your agreed tuition fees to the College once your attendance on the course has been confirmed.



Repayment

- your monthly repayments will be based on your income, not what you borrowed
- you'll only start making repayments when your income is more than £404 per week, £1,750 per month or £21,000 per year
- you'll only pay back 9% of any income above £21,000 a year, see the table below for examples of what you'll repay:

Income each year before tax	Monthly salary	Monthly repayment
Up to £21,000	£1,750	fO
£22,000	£1,833	f7
£25,000	£2,083	£30
£30,000	£2,500	£67
£35,000	£2,917	£105
£40,000	£3,333	£142

So, if you're paid monthly and earn £2,500 before tax you would repay 9% of the difference between what you earn and what the individual threshold is:

£2,500 - £1,750 = £750 9% of £750 = £67.50

Your loan repayment would be £67 in that month.

- if your income drops or rises, for example if you receive a bonus, your repayment amount will automatically change to reflect this; you can make voluntary repayments at any time to pay off your loan more quickly
- if you're self-employed you'll be responsible for making student loan repayments as part of your annual self-assessment tax return
- if you're employed, you don't need to do anything; your employer will take your repayments directly off your salary as they do with tax and national insurance contributions
- if you stop working, your repayments will stop and only start again when your income is more than £21,000 a year
- you'll be due to start repaying your loan in the April after you leave or finish your course, whichever comes first; if you leave or finish your course before April 2016, you won't start making repayments until after this date
- any loan remaining 30 years after you're due to start making repayments will be wiped

Access to Higher Education

• if you successfully complete your Access to HE Diploma, and go on to complete your degree programme, the loan for the Access course is wiped

Earn while you learn

All apprentices must receive the appropriate national minimum wage (£3.30 for under 19 and first year apprentices, £5.13 for 19 and 20 year olds and £6.50 for those aged 21 and over).

A real job

All apprentices should work for at least 30 hours a week, apart from in exceptional circumstances.

Over 150,000 employers are offering apprenticeships in more than 200,000 locations.

Apprenticeships are available at Intermediate, Advanced and Higher (degree) level, covering more than 170 industries and 1,500 job roles.

A real qualification

Quality is key to apprenticeships. All apprenticeships must be at least 12 months long and lead to a national qualification that is respected by employers around the world.

The College also offers a range of NVQ courses that are valued by employers.

A real future

After finishing, the majority of apprentices (85%) will stay in employment, with two-thirds (64%) staying with the same employer.

A third (32%) of all former apprentices had received a promotion within 12 months of finishing, and of those in work, three quarters (75%) reported taking on more responsibility in their job.

Employers think that qualified apprentices are 15% more employable than those with other qualifications.
