




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OUR COLLEGE HAS BEEN GRADED AS A GOOD PROVIDER

A-LEVELS AND SUPPORT

A-levels provide you with a traditional pathway to university and offer prospective employers the higher level qualifications they look for.

VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Vocational courses offer you a different learning experience to A-levels which lean more towards academic learning.

If you are looking for higher level qualifications that combine vocational training with traditional classwork, we offer vocational qualifications such as BTEC, CACHE, VTCT or City & Guilds:

- they are vocational and work-related courses, designed to accommodate needs of employers and allow students to progress to further and higher education
- they take a practical approach to learning, without missing any of the important theory on the subject

WHY SHOULD I TAKE A BTEC?

They are recognised by a large number of companies across a wide range of industries. As well as being developed in partnership with industry representatives so all employer and student needs are met, many professional bodies offer successful BTEC students exemptions for their own accredited qualifications.

If you do not perform well under exam conditions, a BTEC will allow you to undertake a number of units for which you will present evidence, based on real life work and studies. This means you can demonstrate your skills and knowledge through a practical situation rather than sweating it out in an exam hall.

HOW DO BTEC QUALIFICATIONS WORK?

There are different sizes of BTEC qualification at each level. Generally:

- the smallest is the Award
- then the Certificate
- the largest is the Diploma
- results are graded as pass, merit or distinction

THE NUMBER OF UNITS VARIES ACCORDING TO THE LEVEL, DESIGN AND FOCUS OF EACH QUALIFICATION, AND ALL STUDENTS COMPLETE REALISTIC WORK-BASED ASSIGNMENTS, WHICH ARE INTERNALLY ASSESSED.

What's covered?

Year one:

- biological molecules
- cells
- organisms exchange substances with their environment
- genetic information, variation and relationships between organisms

Year two:

- energy transfers in and between organisms
- organisms respond to changes in their internal and external environments
- genetics, populations, evolution and ecosystems
- the control of gene expression

How will my work be assessed?

- exams: 100%, including 12 assessed practicals

Entry requirements

- maths and English language at grade six/grade B or above
- biology, chemistry and physics or double award science at grade six/grade B or above
- two additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above

What can I do after this?

- higher education at university or college to study medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, marine biology, forensic science, nursing or physiotherapy

What's covered?

Year one:

- Novel Frankenstein
- AQA Paris Anthology
- AQA Poetry Anthology: Carol Ann Duffy, Meantime

Year two:

- Coursework (20%)
- Comparison of a Literary and Non-literary Text
- Novel The Great Gatsby; recasting and commentary tasks
- Drama Text: A Streetcar Named Desire

How will my work be assessed?

- written exams: 80%
- coursework: 20%

Entry requirements

- English language and English literature at grade six/grade B or above
- maths at grade four/grade C or above
- two additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above

What can I do after this?

- higher education at university or college in the creative and social sciences, such as journalism or creative writing

ENGLISH LITERATURE A-LEVEL

AQA

How long: Two years
Where: Southend
Code: 25015

What's covered?

- literary genres: aspects of tragedy
- a Shakespeare play, second drama text, one novel and poetry
- evaluate approaches to, for example, heroes, villains, women, race, politics and power
- text and genres: elements of political and social protest writing
- a post-2000 novel, one poetry text, one other text prose or drama
- explore power and powerlessness at the core of each text
- coursework covering theory and independence: select two texts and analyse them through the lens of a specific critical theory, for example Marxism, feminism or post-colonialism

How will my work be assessed?

- written examination: 80%
- coursework components: 20%

- English language OR English literature at grade six/grade B or above

What can I do after this?

FILM STUDIES A-LEVEL

How long: Two years
Where: Southend
Code: 25015

What's covered?

Year one:

- British and American cinema, incorporating topics such as genre, narrative, cinematography and a focus upon a specific era of British cinema
- two pieces of coursework are required, a formal essay and either a photographed storyboard or an extended step outline of an original concept

Year two:

- world cinema as an alternative to Hollywood cinema
- the role of spectatorship in the viewing process, with a particular emphasis on emotional response to film texts
- a close-study of a chosen film
- a small-scale research project on a chosen area of study (usually of a director, genre or star)
- a screenplay

- coursework: 20%
- exams: 80%

Entry requirements

- maths and English language at grade four/grade C or above
- three additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above

Code: 25015

What's covered?

- painting
- drawing
- photography
- printing
- sculpture
- mixed media

Year one:

- coursework unit – portfolios, sketch books and final pieces

Year two:

- coursework including practical work and extended essay 60%
- externally set assignment 40% February - June

How will my work be assessed?

- coursework portfolio: 60%
- externally set assignment: 40%

Entry requirements

- maths and English language at grade four/grade C or above
- art at grade four/grade C or above
- two additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above
- you will also be required to submit an art portfolio

What can I do after this?

- higher education at university or college including our BA (Hons) Fine Art at South Essex College of Higher Education

How long: Two years
Where: Southend
Code: 25015

What's covered?

Year one:

- physical and human geography
- geographical skills
- One compulsory field trip

Year two:

- contemporary geographical issues
- fieldwork investigation or geographical issue evaluation
- 3 compulsory field trips

How will my work be assessed?

- exams: 100%

Entry requirements

- one grade six/grade B and one grade four/grade C or above in English language and geography
- maths at grade four/grade C or above
- two additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above

What can I do after this?

- higher education at university or college to study subjects such as geography, geology and environmental studies

HISTORY A-LEVEL

AQA

How long: Two years
Where: Southend
Code: 25015

What's covered?

- British history consisting of the study of the Tudor Dynasty from 1483 to 1603
- European history dealing with Nazi Germany from 1933 to 1945
- Tsarist and Soviet Russia from 1855 to 1991 (Coursework essay 20%)

Year one:

- change and consolidation
- historical issues: periods of change

Year two:

- the state and the people: change and continuity
- historical enquiry

How will my work be assessed?

- exams: 80%
- Coursework essay: 20%

Entry requirements

- maths at grade four/grade C or above
- English language at grade six/grade B or above
- three additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above

What can I do after this?

- higher education at university or college to study subjects such as history, politics, law, social work and journalism

LAW A-LEVEL

AQA

How long: Two years
Where: Southend
Code: 25015

What's covered?

Year one:

- law making and the legal system: the different ways in which law is created, the sources of law, the various influences that lead to a change in law by parliament and how the legal system works
- the concept of liability: what is required to be guilty of a crime, what is required for a successful civil action in negligence, criminal sentencing and civil sanctions

Year two:

- criminal law: murder, manslaughter, non-fatal offences against the person, theft, robbery, burglary, fraud and possible defences
- concepts of law: law and morality, law and justice, balancing conflicting rights, fault, judicial creativity

How will my work be assessed?

- exams: 100%

- English language at grade six/grade B or above
- maths at grade four/grade C or above
- three additional GCSEs at grade four/grade C or above

What can I do after this?

- higher education at university or college, including the LLB in Law if you wish to pursue a career as a legal professional

Where: Southend

What's covered?

Year one:

- core 1: algebra, coordinate geometry, polynomials, mathematical notation and proof
- core 2: sequences and series, trigonometry, introductory calculus, logarithms
- statistics: classification and presentation of data, probability, hypothesis testing

Year two:

- core 3: proof, exponentials and natural logarithms, functions, calculus techniques, numerical methods
- core 4: further algebra, further trigonometry, parametric equations, further calculus, vector geometry, comprehension
- mechanics: vectors, kinematics, forces, projectiles

How will my work be assessed?

- exams
- assessed coursework is also taken in the second year

- personal investigation: you will submit one personal project that has personal significance - this investigation includes a 1,500-2,000 word personal study
- controlled assignment: you will select one starting point from an early release question paper and will plan and prepare ideas - you will then undertake a 15 hour controlled period to realise your intentions/outcomes

- coursework portfolio: 60%
- practical exam: 40%
